Design Guidelines:

- Demonstrate a clear connection between Mechanical and Industrial Engineering
- Clean, uncluttered look
- Incorporate a human element
- Design should be forward looking and be able to stay relevant over a number of years to come
- Design should be landscape format, not portrait
- Design should be intriguing for a wide audience
